School Counseling Office

- ❖ On October 16th, counselors Ms. Finnerty and Mrs. Higgs, along with Mrs. Pulsipher from the Muskegon Promise, will host a financial aid and FAFSA session in the media center for seniors in Personal Finance, Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus, College and Career Math, and Alternative Ed classes. These sessions are for students only and will be conducted each period of the day with the respective classes.
Students will need to have a charged chromebook, their social security number and a valid email address for a contributor to their FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). As a Dependent student, a contributor is a biological or adoptive parent(s), or a biological or adoptive parent's spouse. - ❖ **After-School Homework Help – NHS Tutoring** -Parents, please encourage your students to sign up! Starting **Tuesday, October 7**, NHS members will provide after-school homework help in **Math, English, Social Studies, and Science** every Tuesday (some exceptions). Sessions run **2:45–3:30 PM in the Media Center**—students must check in with Mrs. Finnerty when they arrive. **Sign up by Sunday night** before each session via the link provided in your student's email or Class Google Classroom; space is limited, so early sign-up is encouraged. An email reminder will be sent the Monday before the session. Encourage your students to bring their class materials and come ready to focus!
- ❖ Ms. Finnerty and Mrs. Higgs will host college application seminars, one day a week through the month of October to help seniors complete their college applications. The sign-up Google form, in the Class of 2026 classroom, will go live at 7:00am on September 29th.
- ❖ Career Education: As part of our Career Readiness work, your child has a new **REQUIRED Xello lesson** called *Parent Check-In: Exploring My Career Interests*. This lesson is designed to encourage meaningful conversations between students and their families about future goals and career exploration.

What to do: Ask your child to log in to Xello and open their **About Me** page and locate their **Career Matches**.

1. Make sure you are **linked to your child's account through Xello Family**. If this is your first time, you'll receive an email invitation from Xello to set up your parent account.
2. Spend a few minutes reviewing your child's top careers together. Talk about which careers seem like a good fit, and share any questions or ideas you may have.
3. After your discussion, your child will record a short reflection in Xello.

Your insight and guidance are extremely valuable in helping your child shape and achieve their future goals. Thank you for partnering with us in this important step.
